

NOISY, SPIRITED SENDOFF FOR 212 DRAFT MEN TODAY

Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs Will
Put Full Lung Power of Or-
ganizations Into Play.

Two hundred and twelve national army men will answer the call to colors in Duluth today, entraining for Camp Lewis, Wash. The first contingent of 51 men from the first city draft district will depart at 7 o'clock this morning. The balance of the men including three city districts and the first county division will entrain tonight.

There will be plenty of noise, lots of cheering, and the most spirited farewell that has been given any draft contingent leaving the city. The Kiwanis and Rotary club have provided for this and to assure their making good, each member was presented with a tin horn by the Commercial club yesterday.

One thousand full grown, able bodied men, will give the little horn the full quota of their lung power, members of the club pledged, so the draft men may feel assured of a spirited and encouraging sendoff.

Men of the first city district assemble at 6:24 o'clock this morning and will leave the West Duluth station of the Northern Pacific at 7 o'clock. At 7 o'clock tonight the third and fourth city districts and first county division will parade from the Shrine auditorium to the Union depot to entrain, the train leaving at 3 o'clock. The second city district will entrain at the West End depot of the Northern Pacific, a parade preceding entrainment from Woodmen hall being the feature.

Men who have been called to report in each district who will likely entrain, unless alternates are needed for some who fall at the last moment, were given out by the local draft boards last night. Following is today's honor roll of the national army.

NOTICE TO DRAFT REGISTRANTS

All registered men should now be classified and examined. Any man who has not been examined, or who has not filed a questionnaire, should go at once to the nearest local board and get their advice on what to do.

Any man who has not been examined yet, is a delinquent, no matter what the excuse may be, and is liable to serious consequences if apprehended by the authorities. It may be through your own carelessness or that of your board, or it may be through mail going astray, but the fact remains that the burden is on you to see that you are properly registered and examined.

If you have been classified, you ought to have your "final classification card." If you have never received this card, lose no time, but write your board about it at once.
