

SHE HAS HUBBY JAILED, THEN ASKS RELEASE

Bride Claims It Was "All a Mistake Due to Jealousy."

DENVER, Sept. 6.—Brought back from Wray, Colo., on a charge of embezzling \$167, constituting all the savings of his bride, Homer F. Moulton, better known by his stage name of Jack Clayton, is languishing in jail, while his wife, who prior to Aug. 8, was Mrs. Jean McKee, is "crying her eyes out" in an endeavor to undo the disaster which she brought upon them through a warrant sworn out for his arrest the day after the ceremony.

She spent a large part of the morning pleading with representatives of the district attorney's office and Judge Henry Bray of the justice court to set her husband free.

"It was all a mistake," she declared tearfully. "One of the chorus girls at the Bijou theater wanted Jack and was jealous of me. When she saw our marriage license published in the paper, she and her friends told me an awful story about him.

Made Love on Bet.

"They said he was already married and had merely made love to me on a bet that he could make me turn over my earnings to him.

"You see, judge, I had given him the money to go up to Wray and buy a billiard concession. When they told me this awful story, I thought he had deceived me, so I swore out the warrant and had him brought back. Please let him go. I'll pay the costs—I haven't any money left, but I'll work till I've turned over every cent I owe.

"After the sheriff had brought him back and put him in the city jail, these people confessed to me that they had made up the whole story about his bet."

Refused to Forgive.

The officers declined to take any action in the case. Moulton will be arraigned in Judge Bray's court. According to his wife, he has thus far refused to forgive her for swearing out a warrant for his arrest the day after they were married.

"I don't blame him," she declared. "I was foolish, and the only thing I care about now is to make reparation."

Moulton is a returned soldier. Mrs. Moulton, a pianist, formerly was in charge of the entertainment bureau of the Jewish welfare board at Camp Funston, Kans.
