

TWICE DIVORCED, DULUTHIAN WILL WED THIRD TIME

Carl S. Van Leven Takes Out License for His Third Wedding Since 1909.

Carl S. Van Leven, age 34, who district court records show has been married and divorced twice since 1909, was granted a license to wed Miss Clara H. Smith, age 25 yesterday.

Van Leven, according to the court records, was divorced from his first wife, Mrs. Margaret Van Leven, in January, 1915. She complained she alleged cruelty and Cecilia Donovan as respondent. Van Leven was first married at Hudson, Wis., January 16, 1909.

Desertion Given as Cause. The second divorce was granted Sept. 1, 1919 upon the petition of Mrs. Margaret Van Leven who filed suit in March, 1919, naming one Clara Smith as respondent. Desertion was given as cause for action.

A lengthy legal battle for the custody of the children followed in which she was victor. After Edward F. Groat, age 39, filed suit for divorce yesterday in district court from his wife, Mrs. Hannah Groat, age 41, she filed counter charges.

The petition of Groat recites that they were married in Duluth May 29, 1916. He alleges that his wife in a fit of temper drove him from his home in April, 1919. Mrs. Groat in her answer, denies his charges and names one May Humphries as co-respondent. The case will be heard at the May term of court.

REASONS GIVEN FOR LOWER PRICES

Weather Conditions Partly Responsible for Sudden Reductions, Says Merchant.

Weather conditions during the spring were the cause of the sudden nation-wide reductions in prices during the last week, according to Lyle A. Oreck, manager of Oreck's store.

"I have just joined in the movement to try to help lower the cost of living by sacrificing profits on present stocks, and also to encourage manufacturers and workers to return to normal production," Mr. Oreck said.

"The market has broken, but it is impossible to predict whether this great general nation-wide price reduction will stand. All manufacturers are asking for a 60 per cent increase above 1919 prices on merchandise for fall, 1920, and it is a question whether or not we will be successful in breaking these prices.

"The price reduction at present is made possible by the fact that manufacturers and retailers have large stocks of merchandise on hand due to adverse weather conditions this spring, and are compelled to unload in order to meet their obligations at the bank."

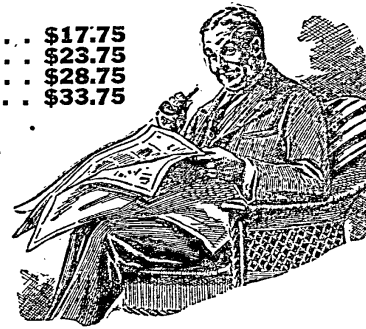
