LONDON, Feb. 12.—Are married people becoming more quarrelsome?

It would seem to be so, for applications for separation orders have increased enormously in the London police courts, according to Rev. Harry Pearson, secretary of the police court mission.

"Many of these are on very frivolous grounds," said Mr. Pearson, "and the magistrate hands the cases over to our missionaries. In 50 per cent of the cases a reconciliation is effected.

"Of course, our missionaries have to be very careful. One of them said to me: 'If I can just get one of them to smile the trick is done.'

"The magistrates handed over 8,500 people to the missionaries during last year, and most of them had domestic troubles."
