

MENORAH ORATORS TO GIVE SYMPOSIUM AT DULUTH CLUB

A symposium on "Jewish Education for the American Jewish Youth" will be presented by a team from the Menorah society of the University of Minnesota Tuesday night at Covenant hall, 12 East Superior street, under the auspices of the Duluth B'nai B'rith lodge. A dancing program will conclude the entertainment.

Three leading orators from the state university, all members of the Menorah society, have been selected to present the symposium in Duluth. The team includes Max Shapiro, winner of the Pillsbury oratorical contest last year, a member of the university debating team three times and a member of Delta Sigma Rho, intercollegiate forensic fraternity; Gerald Friedman, prominent orator, debator and Hebrew scholar, and David Goldstein, member of two college debating teams, member of Delta Sigma Rho and an authority on the prophet Jeremiah.

Morris Wolfe of Hibbing, coach and business manager of the team, will

accompany the young men to Duluth. The Symposium will be presented at Hibbing Sunday evening under the auspices of the B'nai B'rith lodge of the range.

Marvin Oreck of Duluth, president of the Minnesota Menorah society, will preside.
