

Lillian "Lil" Alpert, 101, formerly of Duluth, passed away Thursday, November 30, 2017, in her home in Sarasota, Florida.

Illian was born in Duluth on November 23, 1916, to David and Bessie (Karsner) Steinberg. She graduated from Duluth Central High School in 1933 with high honors, at age 16, having skipped two grades. As a teen, she was a salesperson in a Duluth department store, and she moonlighted as a singer in night clubs. Lillian married Isadore ("Iz") Alpert on Dec. 30, 1937, and together they raised three children. She knitted sweaters and bandages during World War II. She also volunteered at St. Luke's and St. Mary's hospitals, Head Start, and the United Jewish Appeal. She was a Brownie leader, and active in Hadassah, and the Board of the Women's Symphony Association. Having lived seasonally in Florida since 1969, Iz and Lil moved there permanently in 2000. There

she was active in Temple Beth Israel of Longboat Key and the Jewish Federation. Lil gave to a wide range of charities and causes. She was an active and supportive grandmother.

She is survived by her three children, Sheila Alpert of St. Paul, Minn., Mark (Judy) Alpert of Austin, Texas, and Elizabeth Alpert (James Bearden) of Rochester, N.Y.; three grandchildren, Nicole (Steven) Maizes of Brentwood, Calif., Jane (Donald Weikert) Bearden of Montreal, Canada, Emma (Krishna Andvolu) Alpert of Brooklyn, NY, and two great-grandchildren, Aimery Isadore Bearden Weikert, and Kalyan Isaac Alpert Andavolu.


