He was actively involved in the Naples Equestrian Challenge and was a board member of the Catholic-Jewish dialogue. Mr. Kuller's commitment to teaching and helping young children was well known in the communities where he lived, as he taught countless neighborhood children to swim, introduced them to the pleasures of horseback riding, scouting, skiing and sailing.
