Schapiro, Jane S. Malver Wife, mother, and friend, passed away peacefully Sat., Dec. 7, 2013. A native and lifelong Milwaukee resident, Jane, an only child born in 1913, celebrated her 100th birthday with family this year. Jane graduated from West Division High School and continued to the University of Wisconsin. There she gained permission to house a slot machine in her dormitory room to test theories of probability for her thesis and graduated as a business major in 1934. Jane married Arnold Malver the following June and they had two children, Sandra (Stephen) Malver Goodman, Denver,

CO and Frederick (Karen) Malver, New Brighton, MN. Living in Shorewood during WWII, Jane won awards knitting for the Red Cross. After Arnold's death, Jane married William Schapiro. They shared a love of music and had a son, Sherman Schapiro, Blue Lake, CA (life partner Eva-Lynn Janson, Eureka, CA). Until limited by age, Jane remained active in the MacDowell Club, Eastern Star, ORT, National Council of Jewish Women, high school and college reunions and book and bridge groups. She also served as treasurer of the North Shore LX Club and was an avid Milwaukee Brewers fan. Her lovely soprano voice graced community choruses and family gatherings. Jane learned to drive at twelve so she could take her mother shopping. She continued until age 98, successfully passing both road and written driver's tests in 2010 and 2011. Her commitment to relatives and friends will be fondly remembered. In addition to her children, she is survived by five grandchildren, Jonathan Goodman, Boulder, CO; Gillian Goodman, Denver, CO; Aaron Malver, Seattle, WA; Michael Malver, Minneapolis, MN; David Malver, Los Angeles, CA; four great-grandchildren, Benjamin and Sara Goodman, and Max and Evan Goodman Segal; and many nieces, nephews and friends.
