

## PHONE BRINGS RITES IN WEST TO VIRGINIA

Virginia, Minn., Jan. 24.—By means of a special three-way telephone hookup and amplifying system, funeral services in Los Angeles Thursday for Mrs. Parl Wilk, 70, mother of several men prominent in the film industry, were brought to surviving members of the family gathered here and in New York city.

Mrs. Wilk died Sunday while visiting with two sons, Harry and Theodore, on the staff of a film trade paper in Hollywood.

Rites were conducted in Los Angeles chapel by Rabbi Jacob Cohen and the 20 minute service was heard in the Wilk family residence here by the dead woman's husband, M. L. Wilk, pioneer merchant, a daughter, Ethel, and a sister, Mrs. Anna Dobrin, both of Minneapolis, and 40 Virginia relatives and friends.

In his New York city apartment, another son, Harry, proprietor of the Wilk press, listened to the services while in Los Angeles four sons and a daughter, Jacob of New York city, Benjamin of Detroit, Harry and Theodore and Josephine of Detroit were by their mother's bier during the last rites. Burial was in Los Angeles.
