

# BUY OR GET SLUGGED

## FINNETTE'S ROUGH TREATMENT IN SECOND HAND STORE.

### Charges the Polinskys With Knocking Him Down and Kicking Him.

Prosper Finnette swore out a warrant yesterday afternoon for the arrest of Joseph Polinsky and C. M. The elder Polinsky knocked Finnette down and somebody else joined in and helped to kick the prostrated man. That is what Finnette claims.

The Polinskys were arrested and brought into police court last evening. They pleaded not guilty and their trial was set for Wednesday.
