

## ALLEGED FRAUDULENT DROUING.

### Hennessy & Co. Charge a Wholesale Liquor Dealer With It.

Two actions were filed in the United States circuit court yesterday for injunctions restraining the Heller Liquor company and the B. Heller Liquor company from selling or disposing of liquor fraudulently as "Hennessy brandy."

The action was brought by James Hennessy & Co., of the Republic of France. The individual plaintiffs named in the complaints are Jacques Richard Maudrice Hennessy, Jacques Francis Henry Hennessy, James Richard Charles Hennessy, Armand Castillon, Emanuel Castaigne.

It is charged on information and belief that the two defendants have made a practice of bottling and selling under the brand of "Hennessy Brandy," goods that are not real "Hennessy brandy," and to the damage of the complaint have for years sent out their goods under this brand, and until the brand itself is very valuable.

A temporary restraining order is asked and a permanent injunction is prayed for. The plaintiff's attorneys are M. H. Bouteille, T. S. Wood and N. H. Chase.
