

TWO FAMILIES AT OUTS

ISAAC POLINSKY HELD FOR ASSAULTING A NEIGHBOR.

Charles Vexal Will Be Tried July 16, For Fighting—Minor Police Court Items.

Isaac Polinsky of No. 931 Fourth avenue East was arraigned in police court yesterday charged with assaulting Margaret Rusch, a neighbor. The assault is alleged to be the result of several quarrels between the Polinsky and Rusch families and both parties were beseeching the city attorney for warrants. He refused to issue more, however, in the hope that the trial of the one case would somewhat clear up the tangle. The defendant pleaded not guilty and will relate his troubles in court July 20 at 10 o'clock.

Charles Vexal was also arraigned for violating the dignity of the state by taking a punch at G. E. Roscoe. He denied the accusation and trial was set for June 16 at 2 o'clock.

There was a goodly assortment of drunks and vags, nearly all of whom were committed. Jennie Harney, a female degenerate, drew the heaviest sentence and was sent to jail for 20 days for drunkenness. George Lassinger, James Ames, Charles McLaughlin, Charles Alf, Henry Anderson, Thomas Naphin and Edward Gustafson will grace the chain gang with their presence for 10 days, on a similar charge. George Miles, Tom Smith and William Powers were given five days each for trespassing on private property and Andrew Anderson received 10 days for begging on the street.
