

About 400 guests gathered in Keneseth Israel synagogue at 5 o'clock this afternoon to witness the marriage of Miss Gertrude Schulman, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. I. Shulman, and Benjamin Beskin. There were eleven ushers who looked after the guests as they arrived. The members of the bridal party met at the home of the bride's parents on Sixth avenue N. and drove to the church. Schubert's orchestra played the Mendelssohn's wedding march as the bridal party entered, and later furnished an accompaniment for the responses of the cantor. Little Minnie Beskin was flower girl and wore a pink silk frock and carried a basket of flowers. Little Leon Schulman was the page and carried an American Beauty rose in which was the ring. Misses Sarah Berman and Pauline Rabinowitz were bridesmaids and wore white and carried pink and white roses. The maid of honor was Miss Anna Schulman and her gown was white lansdowne trimmed with lace applique and she carried roses. The bride was led by her parents. She wore white taffeta with an overdress of lace trimmed with applique. Her veil was caught with a didiamond pin, the gift of the bridegroom, and her flowers were bride roses. As the bride and her attendants entered by one aisle Mr. Beskin and his best man, Morris Beskin, and the groomsmen, Al Cohen and I. D. Schulman, walked down the other. Mr. Beskin's parents are in Germany and Mr. and Mrs. J. Cohen acted in their place.
