

# DULUTH WOMAN HURT IN WRECK

## Miss Rose Gidding Severely Bruised in Soo Line Smashup.

Miss Rose Gidding, sister of J. M. Gidding of this city, was seriously injured in the wreck of a "Soo" line passenger train at Spanish Station, Canada, about 150 miles east of the American "Soo," Sunday afternoon and arrived in Duluth yesterday. She was taken to Mr. Gidding's home.

Miss Gidding sustained severe injuries to her right thigh and was badly bruised about the hands and arms. A physician stated last night that she had sustained no fractures and unless she suffered some severe after effect of the accident, her condition was not dangerous.

Miss Gidding was on her way from Wilkesbarre, Pa., coming by the way of Montreal, to Duluth, to take charge of one of the departments of the Gidding store. She said last night that the train was moving at a high rate of speed and was nearly nine hours behind time when the accident occurred. The sleeper in which she was riding was overturned and she was removed from the wreck, in an unconscious condition.

Six persons, besides Miss Gidding, were severely injured in the accident. All passengers were transferred to another train and taken to Sault Ste. Marie, where nurses and surgeons were furnished and Miss Gidding was allowed to resume her journey Monday night.

The accident occurred on Canadian Pacific tracks and was supposed to have been caused by ice on the rails. Miss Gidding said last night that if the train had left the rails fifty feet farther down the line the entire train would probably have plunged down a steep embankment.
