

CREDITORS WANT A SQUARE DEAL

Solomon Rubloff, a merchant at Virginia, is defendant in an involuntary bankruptcy case begun in the federal court yesterday, in which his liabilities are alleged to be more than \$1,000.

Sischo & Beard, of St. Paul; William Tonk & Co., Chicago; Benjamin F. Simpson & Co., Minneapolis; McClelland Bros. & Co., of Minneapolis, and Pitkin & Brooks, of Chicago, the petitioning creditors, claimed that Rubloff has violated bankruptcy laws in allowing other firms to secure preference in allowance of claims. It is alleged that suit was begun on a claim due from Rubloff in the municipal court of Hibbing and judgment and attachment upon his stock secured. The petitioning creditors seek to have the attachment set aside and their claims allowed with others under the general bankruptcy practice.
