

DISTRICT COURT ITEMS.

A verdict for \$204.30 has been awarded by the jury to Gust Gudeen in his suit to recover money loaned to Mrs. Anna Hanson in 1894. Gudeen claimed that he loaned the woman \$487 of which only \$120 was repaid. The case was tried before Judge Cant.

The following cases are on for trial today in district court: Arabella Sandstrom vs. Nicholas Kent. Julius Koschman vs. Charles R. Ash. Pearson & Fawcett vs. Adas Israel Chevri Kodisha. Walter Scarlotta vs. Charles R. Ash. Hjalmar Enlund vs. The Giant Grip Horse Shoe company. L. R. Martin et al vs. T. G. Langhren. John Knutson vs. the Duluth Street Railway company.

Judge Dibell has denied the motion made by A. A. Forbes, plaintiff, against Robert Forbes and wife and Henry S. Ely, receiver, asking that a claim for \$1,025 be paid before the Forbes company goes out of existence.

Bryan O'Rourke, who sued the German Insurance company because the latter failed to adjust the insurance on O'Rourke's house within a reasonable time after it was damaged by fire, has secured a verdict of \$742.42. The case was tried in Judge Ensign's court. It occupied a greater portion of the session Tuesday and yesterday.

Amella Woods was given a verdict for \$118.90 in her suit against Thomas St. Cyr. The case arose out of failure to pay a promissory note for \$50 given by St. Cyr. in 1901. The case was tried in Judge Dibell's court.
