

JILTED GIRL SEEKS REVENGE

Russian Jewess Wants Police to Arrest Man Who Is Unwilling to Wed.

Sick and out of funds, Miss Emma Karon, 21 years old, a Russian Jewess, has for three days been trying to induce the police to arrest and punish Herman Bloom for jilting her after 100 invitations to her wedding, which was set for September, had been issued. She repeatedly importuned Sergeant Fiskett to devise some means of punishing the dilatory groom, and has haunted headquarters on her hopeless mission for days.

Miss Karon, of diminutive stature and neatly clad, has the face of a doll and eyes of a child. She told her story without reserve, explaining how two weeks ago she met the man, who she declares built castles in the air and shattered her life by declaring suddenly that he had decided not to marry her. The girl told the police she was in the hospital two weeks before forming an acquaintance with the groom-to-be, and left the institution crippled in body and broken in spirit.

Love at First Sight.

Love at first sight followed her introduction, through mutual friends, to the man who was to have been her husband, and she had looked forward happily to the wedding, when she would have a home.

Miss Karon confessed that she was unable to assign a reason for the strange conduct of her fiancé, unless it was that he has a wife and family in Russia, which she says she fears is the case. She said he was a laborer at the docks and earned good wages. This he had told her, she said, while they were making preparations for the wedding.

She Has No Home.

"I have no home," she told the police when asked why she did not cease wandering from place to place and go home. "My father lives in Chisholm, and he has all he can do to make a living for himself. I don't see why this man should treat me so. I am a good cook, I can bake nice things, am a neat housekeeper, but I am not strong. I was hurt when I was a little girl and have never recovered."

Tears slipped from the eyes of the tiny girl, but she dashed them away and said: "I wouldn't marry that man now for all the money in the world. All I want is to teach him a lesson."

Admitting she was out of funds, the girl said she is temporarily employed by a Jewish family on First street.
