

# LIGHT WEEK IN DISTRICT COURT

## Calendar Has Dwindled Down to a Few Unimportant Cases.

This promises to be the lightest week of the term for the district court. The heavy criminal calendar is showing signs of being completed and there are left but few cases which will take any time. There are three or four grand larceny cases which will be tried and two or three prisoners accused of assault are held. None of these trials will take much time as there is but little evidence to be presented. The state has good cases against most of the accused men.

It is understood that the habeas corpus proceedings brought to secure the release of Nick Cerloske will be decided during the week. Judge Dibell has this matter under advisement and his decision is awaited with considerable interest owing to the peculiar circumstances surrounding the case.

A verdict has been reached in the case of Golda Bosnovsky against Joseph E. Fox and it will be given to Judge Cant this morning. The plaintiff in this case is suing for \$1,025 damages for injuries which she claims were sustained by falling down a stairway in the hardware store owned by the defendant.

The case of Charles Maki against the Cleveland Cliffs Iron Mining company will be given to the jury this morning. The evidence was all presented to the jury last Friday but Judge Ensign delayed charging the jury until he could hear the arguments of the attorneys for the company on their motion for dismissal.

Judge Cant will this morning take up the hearing of the case brought by the Western Land association against the Wisconsin Central Railway company. This case is brought to secure a larger remuneration for some land condemned by the defendants.

Judge Dibell will today conclude the hearing of the damage suit brought by John Hakman against the Oliver Iron Mining company. The suit is for \$20,500 for injuries claimed to have been sustained through being blown up as the result of opening a can of powder with a spike and a stone.

The following cases have been set for hearing during the week. Those which will be called today are: 164, 175, 176, 177, 194, 200½, 145, 146, 147, 148, 150, 293 and 240. Those which will be called Tuesday are 242, 243, 247, 28, 77 and 33.
