

# WANTS \$2,000 FOR HURT TO HIS REPUTATION

The slander case of David Polinsky against Fanny Pass, was taken up in district court late yesterday afternoon before Judge Dibell. After a jury was secured an adjournment until this morning was taken, when the introduction of evidence will be begun.

Polinsky is the proprietor of a clothing store at 711 West Superior street, and some time ago suffered by a fire in his place of business. He claims that on Feb. 20 the defendant, who worked next door, said in Hebrew in the hearing of a number of people who understood the language:

"You set fire to the store, you fire-bug."

It is further alleged that on Feb. 21 Miss Pass said in the hearing of several others:

"No, we didn't have a fire, but that thief, Dave Polinsky, next door, set the place on fire."

Mr. Polinsky claims that his reputation has been damaged to the extent of \$2,000 and is suing for the amount. He is represented by Alexander Marshall. Herbert A. Dancer is appearing for Miss Pass.
