

THIS JURY TOOK NOTES; RETURNS SEALED VERDICT

Bookkeeping appeared to be the principal work of a jury which sat in the case of the Ashland Steel Range company against Peter Handlovsky, tried in the superior court yesterday. After deliberating some time with pencil and paper in their hands the jurors returned a sealed verdict last evening. The suit had its origin in the sale of a lot of stoves by the plaintiff to Handlovsky a year ago.

The stove concern sought to recover \$87. Handlovsky denied the account because he had returned part of the shipment of stoves to the plaintiff. The stove concern contended that the defendant should have kept the stoves and paid for them.
