BAD STORM

Destroys Fruit Blossoms; Kills Lambs, But Does No Injury to Wheat Crop

The storm of May 20 was the worst known to the oldest inhabitant. It rained Tuesday night and on Wednesday both rain and snow fell, accompanied by a cold northeasterly wind. The total precipitation was 1.6-10 inches, with a minimum temperature of 29 degrees.

Stockmen suffered quite a loss, but just how much no one can tell. Many sheepmen had moved to summer camps and were poorly prepared to save young lambs and old ewes. There was also considerable loss in young colts, calves and thin cattle.

At 11 o'clock on Wednesday it was reported from Write Chief Rudisell's office in this city that he had lost all his wires west. Between Dickinson and Belfield 35 poles were down and as many more this side of Medora.
