

TWO MEN INJURED; COLLIDE WITH CAR

Jack Fishman in Hospital—N. Green, Not So Seriously Hurt, Taken Home.

In a collision with a street car at Third avenue east and Second street yesterday afternoon, Jack Fishman of 315 East Ninth street, and N. Green of 411 East Ninth, were thrown from a buggy and both badly cut and bruised.

Green was able to go home, where he received medical attendance but Fishman had to be taken to St. Luke's hospital, where his injuries were dressed. His condition is not thought to be serious. He may have sustained internal injuries.

The young men were driving down Third avenue and it is claimed the car did not stop on the corner, as customary. The motorman was running at a fair rate of speed and could not stop to avoid running the rig down. The horse had cleared the track, but the vehicle was struck and the occupants hurled to the pavement with considerable violence. The rig was torn completely from the hitchings.

The number of the car was 57, but the authorities did not get the name of the motorman.
