

WHAT THE COUNCIL DID.

The council, last night, turned down Alderman Moore's famous curtain ordinance, after one of the most heated debates in the history of the council.

Mayor Haven appointed K. A. Ostergren, Oscar Mitchell and Francis W. Sullivan to the library board.

A resolution directing the grading of Piedmont avenue for a new car extension went over for one week.

A delegation protested against the application for a license of D. Goldish for the Majestic theater, in the West End. The application does not come up for a week.

Mayor Haven withdrew his objections to the North Star Employment company's license with the understanding that it would be for only three months.

The work of collecting the assessment for the Garfield avenue sewer was ordered discontinued and the proposition was postponed indefinitely.
