

WANTS DAMAGES FOR DEATH OF HIS SON

Max Zalk, H. Y. Josephs and Louis Zalk, co-partners as the Duluth Iron & Metal company, and also as the Duluth Machinery company, were yesterday sued by Samuel Zalk as administrator of Julius Zalk's estate to recover \$5,000 be cause of the latter's death while in the employ of the defendants.

It is alleged in the complaint that June 24, 1908, while Julius Zalk, who was 25 years old, was unloading in the yards of the defendants on the water front between First and Fourth avenues east, he was knocked into the water by the end of a timber and drowned.

As he was the principal support of his father, Samuel Zalk, and his mother, Rock Shule Zalk, it is asked that the defendants, through whose negligence the drowning is alleged to have been caused, be ordered to pay \$5,000 to the plaintiff.
