

WASHINGTONS WIN INDOOR CONTESTS

Pull Out Meet Over Other Grade Schools at Boys' "Gym" by Six-Point Margin.

The Washington school won the grade athletic championship by a margin of six points at the indoor meet held last night at the boys' department gymnasium. Five schools were represented and three of them had a monopoly on the points. The scores were: Washington 19 1-3, Adams 14 1-3, Bryant 12 1-3. Franklin and Jefferson also were entered but were credited with no points.

The events were well contested among the first three schools and a good-sized crowd was on hand to witness the competition. It had been intended to take two nights for the meet, but not as many schools were entered as had been expected and it was found possible to run off the events in one evening. The summary:

Standing broad jump—Oscar Benson, (Adams), Roger Whiteside (Washington), Harold Armstrong (Washington). Distance 8 feet, 3 1-4 inches.

Potato race—Elwod Johnson (Bryant), Harold Armstrong (Washington), Simon Peterson (Adams).

Running high jump—Roger Whiteside (Washington). Distance 4 feet, 10 inches. Three tied for place at 4 feet 6 inches. They were Simon Peterson (Adams), Alger Streval (Bryant) and Elmer Whitney (Washington).

Pull-up—Chauncey Larson (Bryant), Henry Azinsky (Washington), H. Norain (Adams). Record, 16 times.

Relay race—Adams team (Peterson, Olson, Benson, Norain), Washington team (Armstrong, R. Larson, Whiteside, Azinsky), Bryant team (Myrman, Mitchell, Streval, C. Larson).
