

ALIENATION SUIT NEARS COMPLETION

Albert Polinsky Declares His Relations With Mrs. Joseph Fox Were Entirely Proper.

The \$25,000 alienation of affections suit of Joseph Fox against Albert Polinsky, which has been on trial in the district court before Judge Dibell for several days, seems to be nearing completion and it is not at all unlikely that the evidence will all be in by adjournment this afternoon.

The presentation of evidence for the defense began yesterday morning under the direction of C. O. Baldwin, Polinsky's attorney. Polinsky was the first witness called and he emphatically denied the allegations of the plaintiff and his witnesses. Even the cross-examination of O. J. Larson, attorney for Fox, failed to do much more than to add to the vehemence with which he asserted that so far as Mrs. Fox is concerned his relations were proper.

Mr. Baldwin stated in his opening that he hopes to show that the case is one of blackmail throughout and openly accused Fox and his former wife of being blackmailers.

Flo Coupland, who came from Pittsburg to testify, was called in the morning by the defense and her evidence, together with that of several

police officers, was for the purpose of showing things done by Fox since his divorce.

The last witness before adjournment was David Polinsky, a cousin of the defendant, who claims to have been "on the inside" with Fox and to have known all his plans. The case will be resumed this morning.
