

# THREE COMPANIES ARE FORMED HERE

## Articles of Incorporation Filed by New Concerns to Do Busi- ness in This County.

Articles of incorporation were filed with the register of deeds yesterday by three new companies which will do business in St. Louis county and all with offices in Duluth.

The Duluth Bricklayers' Hall association was one. The incorporators are H. M. Todd, William Towner, Thure Ekroot, D. E. Hartwick and J. O. Larson. They represent union No. 3 of Duluth, Bricklayers' International union, and the principal purpose of the corporation is to provide quarters for the union which it shall own and control. There is no capital stock.

The Greysolon Farms company is another which filed a certificate. Its capital stock is placed at \$200,000 and the debt limit at the same figure.

The incorporators are William Elder, Arthur Howell and M. E. Riley and they, with John G. Williams and Charles P. Craig, will compose the board of directors, which at its first meeting will choose officers for the new company.

The purpose of the corporation is to deal in lands and the settlement, improvement and cultivation of the same, and also to buy and sell stocks and bonds.

The third corporation to file a certificate is the Shapiro Realty company, the incorporators and directors being Max P. Shapiro, I. Freimuth and J. H. Sattler, all of Duluth. Mr. Freimuth is president of the company, Mr. Shapiro, vice president, and Mr. Sattler, secretary and treasurer.

The capital stock will be \$50,000 and the debt limit the same. The purposes of the company are to deal in real estate and its products, control any mineral lands that may be located and transact mercantile business of any kind.
