## BUHL WILL HAVE BIG CELEBRATION

Citizens of Village Propose to  
Raise \$1,000 to Pay Ex-  
penses of Good Time.

BUHL, June 27.—This village, although one of the smallest on the range, will have a Fourth of July celebration that will compare favorably with any of them. Hibbing and Virginia, the biggest towns on the ranges usually spend about \$1,000 each for their celebration of Independence day, and Buhl proposes to do just as well as its bigger brothers. It has set out to raise \$1,000 for its celebration, and is going to accomplish it, for a total of \$600 in cash has already been secured.
