BOOSTERS OF DULUTH-FARGO ROAD NAME COHEN AS LEADER

E. J. Filiatrault, Duluth, Elected to Vice-Presidency With J. T. Hardy, Fargo

BRainerd, Oct. 3.—At the annual meeting of the Duluth-Fargo Highway association, at Wadena, emphasis was placed upon the prediction that the route between the two cities is destined to become one of the most used in this section of the northwest, and that general community pride demands that this highway be placed in first-class condition.

Scenery, character of soil available for road building, grades and elevations, were discussed in detail. Brainerd was honored in the unanimous re-election of Henry I. Cohen to the presidency of the association. E. J. Filiatrault of Duluth, and J. T. Hardy of Fargo were named vice-presidents, and W. E. Verity of Wa-

dena secretary treasurer, to succeed John Dower of that city, who declined re-election. Dower and W. A. Syreen of Crow Wing county, were named trustees.

G. A. Schumacher of Rock Island, Ill., owner of 1,500 acres near Pillager, advocated the route on the north side of the river there. The route between Motley and Staples, over which there is some contention, will be decided in June.
