

MICHAUD FROM ST. LOUIS TO HOLLAND

Well Known Hotel Manager
Leaves Hostelry He Conducted
Nearly Score of Years.

J. T. Michaud, manager of the St. Louis hotel for the last 18 years, yesterday accepted a position with the Holland hotel. Beginning Monday, he will be one of the managers of that hostelry. Sol Goldberg has been the active manager ever since the hotel was opened, and now that Mr. Michaud is going there Mr. Goldberg says he will immediately transfer to him many of his duties and responsibilities.

Mr. Michaud had been identified with the St. Louis hotel for so many years his friends cannot easily reconcile his being with any other hotel. He received offers as assistant manager of the West hotel of Minneapolis and of the Merchants of St. Paul, in addition to the offer from the Holland in Duluth. Mr. Michaud says that he accepted the Holland offer because he preferred to remain in Duluth, which has been his home so long. He enjoys a very wide acquaintance with the traveling public and counts his friends by the hundreds in northern Minnesota and Wisconsin.

Another man who will be missed

from the St. Louis is P. H. Levy, the cigar and periodical man. The new management of the hotel will conduct this department itself in future. Mr. Levy has been conducting the cigar and news stand at the St. Louis for 20 years. For the last five years he has been paying \$225 a month for the little space under the stairway in the hotel. He says that he made money in former years at the stand, but that the rent which he has paid for the last five has been more than he could afford. Mr. Levy has not formulated his plans for the immediate future.
