

BUT FEW CASES ON CALENDAR

Greater Portion of Criminal Trials
in the District Court Are
Completed.

FOUR MEN PLEAD GUILTY TO CHARGES

Three Are Sentenced to Terms
in Prison by Judge
Dancer.

Although the May grand jury returned many indictments and the criminal calendar for the term was heavy, it has now been nearly all cleared up and but two or three cases are yet to be heard. These are the cases of perjury and subornation of perjury resulting from the Brookston election and that against Do Courcey Niles on a charge of embezzlement.

Four men pleaded guilty before Judge Dancer yesterday and three were sentenced. Bruno Halicki admitted forgery and was sentenced to an indeterminate term at Stillwater. He was accused of disposing of a forged check to Sam Smith, which was made payable to Julius Shrader and signed Jacob Schuler.

Harry Rapaport and Sam Pollnsky, indicted for running a disorderly house on First street near First avenue west, were fined \$25 and costs after they had entered pleas of guilty. They ran a pool room, which, it was claimed, was the resort of drunken and disorderly men and made the place a nuisance.

Hjalmar Peterson pleaded guilty to the charge of assault in the second degree. He attacked and cut John Maki with a knife on March 9 of this year, according to the indictment.
