

"WHITE SLAVERY" IS ALLEGATION

Woman Claims to Have Given
Man \$5 Per Day—Also
Fine Raiment.

Prosecution under the law which forbids a man from accepting money or other valuables from women of immoral character, is to come to Robert Levin, who was arrested yesterday. The arrest followed a complaint by Theresa Ray, an inmate of a St. Croix avenue resort, who claimed that she had been supplying Levin with money and that he had been living with another woman at the Alvarado hotel. The specific charge on which Levin was arrested was the theft of a pair of opera glasses. Later a complaint was sworn out under the new law mentioned above.

The woman states that she has furnished Levin with an average of \$5 a day and has purchased clothing for him. When the man was arrested he was well dressed, and it is said that his wardrobe is well stocked. The police claim that he admitted having received \$25 from the Ray woman. When arrested at the hotel the second woman in the case was with him. She objected strenuously to his being taken by the officers, claiming that they were man and wife. It is said that the two had been "hitting the pipe."

If the case against Levin under the "White Slave" law is prosecuted vigorously it will go hard with him if convicted as the penalty is a severe one. He will probably be arraigned today. It is probable that he will be prosecuted on the larceny charge first.
