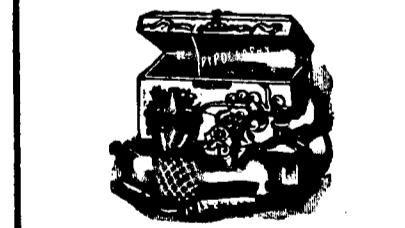

### NIGHT SCHOOL VERY POPULAR

### MAKE FORMAL CONVEYANCE OF LIBRARY SITE

City Council Instructs Mayor and Clerk to Convey Property to D. W. & P. Ry. Upon Compliance with Terms of Franchise.

A resolution passed by the council Tuesday evening authorized and directed the mayor and city clerk, upon compliance of the conditions of Ordinance No. 120 granting to the Duluth, Winnipeg & Pacific railway a right-of-way through the city, to make formal transfer of the land comprised in the present library site at a price of \$12,000.

The present library site at the west end of Chestnut street will be the location of the proposed new depot to be erected at a cost of \$50,000 by the company the coming season, the grading and piling for the new line, which is an extension of the Canadian Northern system, having been completed during the winter months.

The new line will likely be running its own trains into Duluth within the next ninety days, and Virginia may naturally expect a betterment in train service with the head of the lakes.

A great amount of freight also goes through over the line, at the present time an average of five train-loads of wheat from the Canadian northwest going through this city to Duluth, being transferred from the Canadian Northern system to the Duluth, Missabe & Northern at this point.

The building of the proposed new depot at the west end of Chestnut and the opening of the new line between this city and Duluth will have a natural tendency to enhance property values in the west block on the street, and already a number of new buildings in that section are considered.

### IRONWOOD GETS NEXT NATIONAL SKI TOURNAMENT.

Since the Duluth Skee Club made its "flunk" from the national association after the winning of the National Skee Tournament for 1913, the association has decided on holding the next national tournament in Ironwood.

The Virginia Club made a strong bid for the honor before it was won by Duluth, Ironwood being ahead of us in the vote. It is more than probable, however, Virginia will "cop out" the 1914 tourney, the local slide receiving high praise from riders.

### SETTLED WITH INSURANCE ADJUSTERS

Jereissati Bros. Come to Agreement on Damaged Stock and Ship \$5,000 Worth to Chicago Salvage Company.

Jereissati Bros., whose store has been closed for ten days past owing to a fire in the Anderson building occupied by their ladies' department, on Wednesday came to an amicable adjustment of their loss with Mr. Warner, representing the Western Adjustment Company, shipping approximately \$5,000 worth of damaged goods to the Chicago Salvage Company, the insurance companies paying cost price for same and taking charge of that amount of stock.

The store will be reopened on Tuesday next with a big sale, the remaining stock being placed on sale at figures which will insure its quick disposition. The insurance company took all stock which was actually damaged, but in order to make rapid disposition of everything else prices will be cut to the quick and the conservative buyer will not overlook the opportunities to be offered.

The store opens for business promptly at 9 o'clock on Tuesday morning, and the early buyer will find stock and sizes complete. Be on hand early and make your selections.

### BASKET BALL TONIGHT.

The Hibbing and Virginia basket ball teams will meet this evening in the gymnasium of the Technical High School, in the first contest between the teams for the season.

The Hibbing team has thus far defeated Chisholm, Gilbert, Grand Rapids and Cloquet, and lay claim to the championship of Northern Minnesota. But Hibbing usually "lays claim" whether deserved or not. It will be time at the close of the game to say whether or no the claim is to be disputed, but we opine it will.

### GERMANIA MINE CLOSED DOWN

The old Germania mine, located just west of Hurley on the Gogebie, was closed down on Wednesday, affecting about 100 men. The Germania has been worked on a small scale for a long term of years by Hayes Bros., fee owners of the property, but the ore body has been exhausted and the mine closed for good, the pumps being pulled.

### WILL CONSIDER PETITION FOR CHARTER CHANGES

Commission Will Meet on Thursday Evening Next to Debate Question of Police Regulation Change Desired by Petitioners

A special meeting of the city charter commission has been called by Secretary Poirier at the request of the president for Thursday evening next, March 7, for the consideration of the petition filed some time since by sixty-two free-holders asking for definite changes in the charter regulating the police department, the petition asking that the mayor of the city be an active member of the police and fire commission and president of that body, and also that the mayor for any cause appearing to him to be sufficient, have the power to remove any police officer at any time.

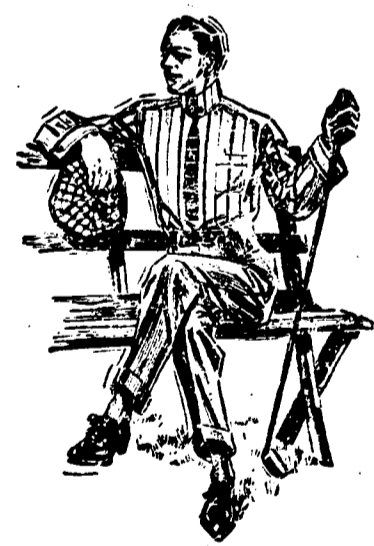
Secretary Poirier has referred the proposed changes to Bert Fessler, of Duluth, and in an opinion rendered on the same mailed to the members of the charter commission this week he questions the legality of the petition on the ground that the sixty-two names appearing thereon did not constitute 5 per cent of the voting population of the city at the time of its presentation, although it did contain 5 per cent of the vote cast at the last general election, and suggests the charter be so amended as to make explicit this questionable phase.

The changes as suggested by the petitioners meet in some respects with the approval of all citizens, but in other respects their adaptability is questioned by some. The creation of the police and fire commission was sprang from the intent of taking the police department, especially, out of politics, but it has seemingly failed of this object, and we believe the citizens as a whole would be better satisfied should the section of the charter relating to the placing of the police department on a civil service basis be rescinded, leaving the question of appointment and of removal strictly within the power of the mayor, as under the former charter.

At the coming meeting of the charter commission other matters touching upon city government and regulation will be discussed, and it is not improbable the commission form of municipal government will receive attention.

Should the charter commission decide that in their opinion the petition presented relating to police and fire commission powers and duties is sufficient, a special election will be called upon the provisions of the charter for the submission of the point to the voters. At the same time, other points will doubtless be submitted for public opinion to be expressed by ballot.

To All Saloon Keepers of the City of Virginia and To Whom It May Concern.

YOU WILL PLEASE TAKE NOTICE. That under the provisions of the City Ordinances of Virginia and of the laws of the State of Minnesota, it is required that all saloons be kept closed and that all persons be excluded therefrom between the hours of eleven o'clock P. M. and five o'clock A. M. of each week day, and shall be closed on the Sabbath Day and all general and special election days. The city ordinances further require that the room where intoxicating liquors are licensed to be sold shall be so arranged that the entire bar thereof may be in view from the street, and no screen, blind or obstruction to this view, shall be placed or erected so as to prevent an entire view of the bar from the street during the time when a saloon is required to be closed.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN. That the provisions above specified will be strictly enforced and within ten days from date all saloons within the city must be so arranged to conform to the provisions of the above ordinance so that the full view of the bar may be had from the street during the time said saloon is required to be closed. Further that no sleeping rooms shall be maintained in connection with a saloon, and no person shall be permitted to occupy or be in a saloon during the hours when the same is required to be closed. Any person failing to comply with all conditions of the above mentioned ordinance within ten days from date will be arrested and dealt with according to law.
