

GETS VERDICT OF \$2,475 AGAINST MOSES COOK

The jury in the case of Joseph Oreckovsky against Moses Cook handed down a verdict in district court yesterday for the plaintiff in the sum of \$2,475. Oreckovsky sued Cook for \$10,000 damages and, according to the evidence, because the latter led him to believe his, (Oreckovsky's) bid of \$15,000 on the stock of the Twin Ports Clothing company would be accepted. As a consequence Oreckovsky did not increase his bid which he was ready to do so and was unable to make the purchase.

Oreckovsky is an appraiser of clothing stocks and he estimated the value of the Twin Ports clothing stock at \$32,000. Cook, who was a creditor of the company, approached Oreckovsky to appraise the stock and put in a bid, as he himself could not buy it. Oreckovsky attributes his failure to negotiate a deal to Cook and figures his attending loss on the basis of profits he would have made in reselling the stock.
