

# COUNTERFEITER GETS TWO YEARS

Edward Paul, Arrested With Sam Polinsky, Will Be Sent to Fort Leavenworth.

---

Two years in the federal prison at Fort Leavenworth, Kas., and a fine of \$25 was the fine imposed on Edward Paul, who pleaded guilty to a charge of counterfeiting, by Judge Page Morris in United States court yesterday morning.

Paul was arrested in company with Sam Polinsky last December, and it was claimed the two boys were operating a counterfeiting plant in the West End. They were grabbed as they were boarding a Minneapolis train. About two weeks ago Polinsky was acquitted in federal court of the charge, the testimony tending to show Paul was the guilty party. The prisoner will be taken to Fort Leavenworth Friday by United States Marshal Frank Tuft.

James Papadiches will be taken to St. Cloud this afternoon to serve two years at the reformatory for forging a postal money order on the McGregor, Minn., postoffice.
