

POLICE ARREST FOUR SUSPECTS

Authorities Nearing a Solution
of the Mystery of Bru-
tal Murder.

VICTIM IS IDENTIFIED AS
THOMAS MORGAN, A POLE

Unfortunate Battered to an Awful
Death—The Deed Was
Witnessed.

Four men were arrested by the police last evening suspected of being implicated or knowing of the facts surrounding the brutal murder of Thomas Morgan, a Pole who died at 9 o'clock yesterday morning from a fractured skull and other injuries received at the hands of two men. The suspects are A. Roski, aged 44 years, saloon swamper; Dominick Sewalski, 25, bartender; Tony Kelaski, aged 30, laborer; Alec Conrad, aged 22, laborer. All underwent an examination last night and that the police are approaching circumstances of the case was intimated.

Morgan was pummeled to death at 4 o'clock yesterday morning in the rear of the meat market owned by Ben Milavitz at 1609-11 North Fifth street. Milavitz heard the pitiful shrieks of the victim but did not venture forth, as the murder took place against his very door. He was forced to hold the door lest the scuffling men fall through it. It was daylight and Milavitz could see the death dealing blows. Morgan was picked up in an unconscious state and taken to the hospital.

The dead man was 35 years of age and lived at 613 Tower avenue. He resided here for the past six years and worked on the Allouez coal dock. He was considered a steady worker by the many friends who called at LeSage's parlors yesterday to gaze at the battered features.

Morgan was one of a party of men who participated in a game of cards on the night of his death. The police are striving to locate the house where it occurred. The belief is that a row arose over the game and that Morgan was forced to flee for safety. He was pursued by two men. He was seen by Mr. Milavitz and G. Johnson, of 1606 North Fifth street. The Johnson girl stated that she heard loud talking and looking out of the window, saw three men. The word "beat" she said, was frequently mentioned during the argument. Milavitz stated that the two assailants were joined down the street by two companions and that the four went together down the street.

A full investigation will be conducted today and developments are expected to ensue.
