

ZIONISM STRANGE TO MANY HEBREWS

Local Jew Says His People Don't
Know of Theodor Herzl's
Work.

While the idea of Zionism is not new, there are thousands of Jews in America who know practically nothing of it.

This is the belief of A. Mogelson, secretary of the local Ohave Zion gate, under whose auspices memorial services for Theodor Herzl, founder of Zionism, will be conducted tomorrow night at Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street.

The principal address will be delivered by Dr. Benjamin Horwitz, whose topic has been announced as "Herzl and the Lesson He Taught." Rabbi I. S. Teplitz will speak in Yiddish.

"For those Duluthians who have but slight knowledge regarding one of the greatest figures in Jewish history, the meeting will be a revelation," said Mr. Mogelson. "The achievements of Dr. Herzl and his influence in the destiny of the American Jew will be clearly depicted. The number of Jews who know little or nothing regarding him is surprising and will run into many thousands."
