

## JUDGE MORRIS HAS BUSY DAY ON RETURN

Although just returned from his

trip to St. Paul yesterday morning, Judge Morris of federal court examined applicants for citizenship, disposed of several minor cases and heard the case of Gilchrist Transfer company vs. the Union Towing and Wrecking company. He expects to return to St. Paul Monday.

In the latter suit the Gilchrist company is attempting to sue the Union Towing and Wrecking company for damages said to have been incurred several years ago when the tug Record is alleged to have damaged the steamer Merida to the extent of \$3,691.88 in a collision near Rices point.

Ott Tarum.

R. C. Pickering said that the Mining company had made a settlement and the case was dismissed.
