

MOTHER-IN-LAW IS BLAMED FOR FUSS

Abraham E. Levine, Under Suspended Sentence, Airs Trouble When Haled Into Court.

Too much mother-in-law, and interference by members of his wife's family in his domestic affairs, was attributed yesterday by Abraham E. Levine to the unpleasantness and infelicity which has arisen in his household. Levine was brought before the court on complaint of his wife, Sato Levine.

He was given a suspended sentence to Stillwater prison Oct. 8 after pleading guilty to wife desertion. At that time he agreed to go to work and care for his wife and four children. Judge Fesler conditioned his parole in the custody of Probation Officer Rasche, upon a promise that he forswear the use of liquor. Mrs. Levine told the court yesterday that her husband has been drunk on several occasions lately. He denied the use of intoxicants and insisted that he had been supporting his family but that the constant interference of her relatives caused his wife to make complaint to the court. Judge Fesler gave him another chance and extended the parole for another three months with permission to go to Minneapolis and accept a position. He must make regular weekly payments of \$5 to the probation officer for the maintenance of his family.
