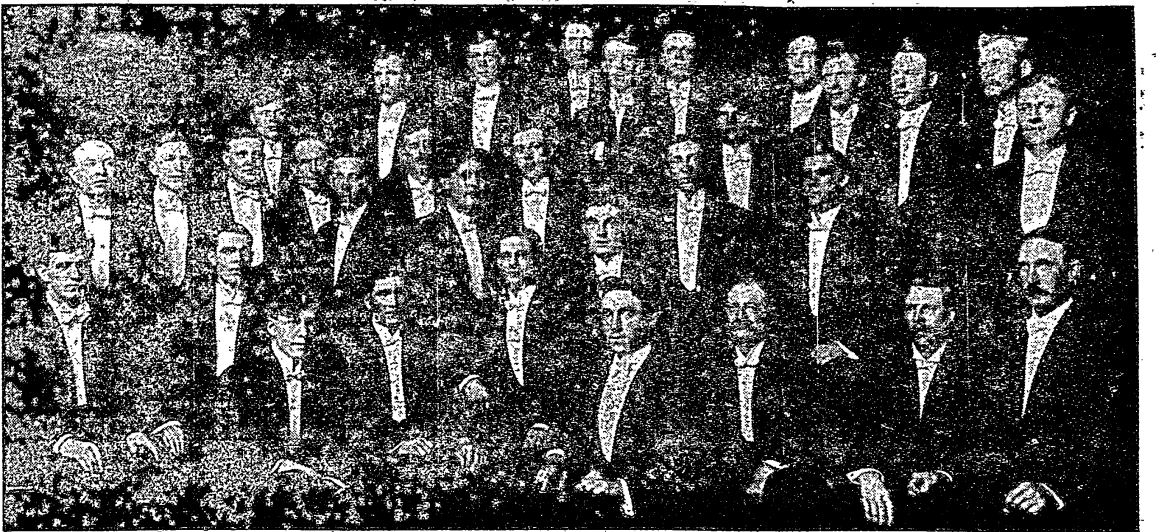


Singers Are in Excellent Voice and Will Give Program Tonight
