Prisoner Escapes from Work Farm.

A second escape of a prisoner from the joint city and county work farm since January was reported when Anton Kolbi made his getaway at 10 o'clock yesterday morning. Committed March 18 on a charge of nonsupport, he was serving a 90-day sentence.

The first prisoner to escape from the "works" was Oscar Palo, age 27, who got away April 6. He had served a few days of a 60-day sentence imposed after he had been found guilty of stealing a suitcase from the Union station.
