Orders Fund Distribution.

Settlement of a death claim against the Northern Pacific Railway company

by Ella McCloskey for \$5,000 for the loss of her husband, Stephen J. McCloskey, was approved by District Judge Fesler yesterday, and a distribution of the fund was ordered. After all expenses of the settlement are paid, \$4,882.23 was left. The court directed that \$3,255.49 be retained by Mrs. McCloskey as guardian of her minor son, James P. McCloskey, and \$1,627.74 as her statutory portion. McCloskey slipped on the ice and fell beneath one of the company's trains in the Duluth yards Feb. 14. His widow and child live at Forestville, Wis.
