The pictures at the Bijou showing the Love Route are very good and on the board of city commissioners yesterday morning, City Engineer F. L. Anders in a communication to the board today, recommended that the water works department should be separated from the engineer's office as recommended in the message.

The communication was read this morning at the session, received and placed on file. It is as follows: "To The Honorable Board of City Commissioners, Fargo, N. D. 'Gentlemen: In the president's message submitted to you for your consideration on April 20, 1915, there appears the following statement: 'The water works department should be separated from the engineer's office. The engineer's office is now over-crowded and ought not to be burdened with this extra work.'"

"This statement tends to give an erroneous impression and is not in accord with the facts as related to Fargo and the recommendations do not conform to the tendency with the best current practices over the country. It seems necessary to address this communication to you, to state the reasons therefor."

"The design, supervision of construction and operation of a water works plant are purely engineering functions. There are few water works of consequence or efficiency operating in the country today that have not a trained engineer somewhere in their organization, and where possible, he will be found in supreme command. When the engineer is not a controlling factor, politics is. This is in no wise a reflection on the capable men who have entered the water works line through political channels and have made good because of the force of their character and ability. The exception simply proves the rule."

"The design, supervision of construction and operation has been subject to the control and guidance of Mayor's Lovell and Sweet and Combs, under the supervision of the writer. The results of nearly three years' operation speak for their design and operation. The stability of the structure needs no defence here. Generally speaking, when men are successful in an undertaking they are allowed to continue their pursuit of the work at hand. That is logical conclusion which has been recognized in private practice and is being more generally observed in public office."

"In all cities where the volume of the work and the surrounding conditions warrant it, the water works is logically a part of the city engineer's office. Milwaukee and Madison, Wisconsin, and Winnipeg, Canada, and Grand Forks, N. D., are examples. Many others might be cited. Where the work warrants it, as in larger cities, a separate engineering organization prevails. As a matter of fact, the only limitation that should be placed, is that of the capability of the engineer to handle the water works."
