

MOORHEAD MAN IS 'SEVERELY' INJURED

Moorhead, Minn., Sept. 7:—Herman Wilk, proprietor of the Empire Bottling company of this city, is lying at home today with a broken breast bone, a broken rib and several bad cuts about the head as a result of an automobile accident early last night. The attending physician said today that Mr. Wilk's injuries were not of a serious nature, but that he would have to be confined to his home for several days.

The accident occurred on the west side of the Red river near Hickson, N. D., at 8:30 o'clock last night. Mr. Wilk was driving his roadster and was in the act of turning from a prairie road, down a hill, toward the river. It was dusk, and he did not see an approaching threshing engine coming up the hill. His car struck the front of the engine with force enough to throw him against the wheel and the windshield, the glass breaking and cutting his face in several places. It was said that there was no light on the threshing rig.

Mr. Wilk was half dazed for a few minutes and was picked up by the engine crew. He was then brought to his home in this city.
