

# FOOTBALL STAR IS BADLY HURT

Munroe Shanedling Is Crushed  
Under Auto Bus Which Turns  
Over on Hill Near Tower.

GAME WITH ELY TEAM  
IS CALLED OFF BY PHONE

Virginia Eleven Meets With Acci-  
dent While Traveling to Ver-  
milion Range Town.

TOWER, Oct. 9.—Munroe Shanedling of Virginia, son of Julius Shanedling of that city, and star end of the Virginia football team, was seriously injured this morning when the auto bus of the New Fay hotel, which was carrying the Virginia team to Ely, tipped over on the Long Lake hill, eight miles north of Tower, and turtled into the ditch.

The accident happened when the engine of the auto bus stalled on the hill. An attempt was made to back the car and it ran over a steep bank and rolled some distance down the hill. Shanedling was pinioned beneath the bus and was badly injured about the head and may have sustained internal injuries.

#### Taken to Hospital

Physicians were summoned at once from this city and Shanedling was hurried to the Soudan hospital, where he was attended by Dr. Burns. Three other members of the team were bruised and shaken, but their injuries were of a minor nature and they were able to return to Tower after their bruises had been dressed. Al Freeman was owner of the car.

After a thorough examination Dr. Burns at the Soudan hospital announced that Shanedling had no broken bones and that he was resting comfortably. He declared that the boy probably will suffer no permanent ill effects.

#### Bus Is Damaged.

The auto bus was badly wrecked and has been brought back to this city to be repaired. The Virginia team all suffered from the shock of the accident and a telegram was sent to the management at Ely reporting the accident and canceling the game.

When the bus rolled over Shanedling was caught under it. He was rendered unconscious by the shock. He remained pinioned until the 14 athletes, by main strength, lifted it so he could be pulled from under.
