

# STOCK GETS FIVE YEARS IN PRISON

Northern Electrical Company Em-  
ploye, Convicted of Theft,  
Draws Heavy Penalty.

## JUDGE FESLER IMPOSES THREE OTHER SENTENCES

Two of These Placed on Probation—Another Jailed Till  
Fine Is Paid.

District Judge Bert Fesler yesterday imposed sentence upon four men, two of whom were convicted recently, following indictment by the September grand jury. The other two pleaded guilty to informations sworn against them yesterday by Mason M. Forbes, first assistant county attorney.

Frank H. Stock drew the heaviest penalty. He was sentenced to Stillwater for not more than five years for grand larceny in the second degree. He was arrested a few days ago and pleaded guilty yesterday.

### Accused of Embezzlements.

The specific charge against Stock was the theft of \$49.65 from the Northern Electrical company where he was employed as a bookkeeper. His employers asserted he systematically conducted embezzlements for a period of several months, amounting to more than \$300. Stock admitted stealing upward of \$100.

Edward G. O'Hearn pleaded guilty to forgery in the second degree. Last March he forged the name of E. A. Dahl to a draft for \$12.50 which he passed on Ben Friedman, 464 Mesaba avenue. Then he left Duluth and was away till a few weeks ago. He gave himself up as soon as he came home.

### Paroled for a Year.

Judge Fesler sentenced O'Hearn to the reformatory and paroled him for a year, provided he obtains work, supports his mother, and reports regularly to the parole officer.

Oni Maki, convicted of robbery in the third degree, was sentenced to the reformatory and placed on probation.

Signar Johnson was fined \$300 and costs and remanded to the county jail pending payment of the fine. He was convicted last week of a statutory charge.
