To the Honorable Page Morris, Judge

said District, respectfully represents:
That on the 9th day of October, 1915,
last past, he was duly adjudged bank-
rupt under the Acts of Congress relat-
ing to bankruptcy; that he has duly
surrendered all his property and rights

decreed by the Court to have a full
discharge from all debts provable
against his estate under said bankrupt
acts, except such debts as are excepted
by law from such discharge.
