

COHEN PLEADS GUILTY; ROBS COUSIN OF WATCH

Probably because his wife and two little children would be the principal sufferers if Samuel Cohen was sent off to prison, District Judge Fesler yesterday morning suspended for one year a 90-day sentence to the county and city work farm. Cohen pleaded guilty to grand larceny in the second degree. He stole a watch and chain worth \$68 from his cousin, H. Davis, 2222 West Michigan street, July 4, 1914, because he wanted to get money to pacify his wife, who had threatened to prosecute him for nonsupport. This was the story he told the court.

Judge Fesler allowed the parole on condition that Cohen gets work and provides for his little family. His failure to comply with the court's directions will result in the sentence being invoked.
