

# CLOSER CO-OPERATION AMONG JEWS, IS PLEA OF KANSAS CITY RABBI

Founding of synagogues in smaller cities of the country and organization of societies for more intimate social relationship of the Jewish people are among the present-day needs of Judaism, declared Rabbi Samuel M. Cohen of Kansas City, representative of the United Synagogue, last night at Adas Israel synagogue. "The Present Needs of Judaism," was the subject of Rabbi Cohen's talk.

Establishing synagogues and organizations to effect a closer relationship between the immigrant father and the educated son are chief features of the work done by the United Synagogue, an organization of orthodox Jewish congregations of the country, according to Rabbi Cohen. He pleaded for co-operation in the work being carried on by the synagogue.
