

SUPPOSED DULUTHIAN DROWNS AT BAYFIELD

Seized With Cramps, W. J.
Saunders Drowns in Presence
of Score of Boys.

Seized with cramps as he leaped into the lake from the Booth dock at Bayfield, Wis., Tuesday to exhibit his aquatic prowess in the presence of a score of boy swimmers, W. J. Saunders, drowned before aid could reach him.

Saunders' home is believed to be in Duluth. He went to Bayfield two weeks ago entering the employ of the Wachmuth Lumber company. His body, recovered after an hour's dragging of the lake near where the fatality occurred, is now at a Bayfield morgue awaiting the arrival of relatives.

Fifteen-year-old Theodore Klatsky was drowned and William Salnovitz narrowly escaped a similar fate as he attempted to rescue the lad after he had been seized with cramps while in swimming Tuesday afternoon in Beaver Lake.

A. J. Klatsky, formerly of Duluth but now of Canosia township, is the father of the boy. Salnovitz is proprietor of the Universal Electric company there.
